 **100202 - Introduction to Risk Management**  
Risk is inherent in all we do. The dynamic and often uncertain nature of Coast Guard operations expose personnel to hazards that increase operational risk. A deliberate and systematic process is necessary to identify, assess, and control hazards and manage risk.

 **502325 - Incident Command System (ICS 210)**  
This course prepares Type 4 Incident Commanders and First Federal Officials On-Scene to operate as single resource leaders in a Type 4 or Type 5 incident. Type 4 Incident Commanders could include coxswains, aircraft commanders, boarding officers, pollution responders, facilities inspectors, and command center staff.

 **VEX(WK-05) - 2014 Vessel Examiner Required Annual Workshop (RVE)**  
This purpose of this required workshop is to provide refresher training for Vessel Examiners to include current and new requirements and provide practical and relevant knowledge to assist in serving the boating public. This activity focuses on four areas: Process and Procedures, Conducting the VSC, Paddle Craft, and Operational Facilities.
